1. ***The Story Behind Alberta Names*** by Harry Sanders
The context of people's lives and careers, and the relationship between individuals and the places named for them.
2. ***The Best Edmonton Stories*** by Tony Cashman
Short stories about the early history of Edmonton.
3. ***A Column of Fire*** by Ken Follett
In 1558, the ancient stones of Kingsbridge Cathedral look down on a city torn apart by religious conflict. As power in England shifts precariously between Catholics and Protestants, royalty and commoners clash, testing friendship, loyalty, and love.
4. ***The Song of Achilles*** by Madeline Miller
Retells the story of Greece's greatest hero from the point of view of his best friend Patroclus.
5. ***The Invention of Wings*** by Sue Monk Kidd.
Hetty "Handful" and Sarah Grimke are the stars of this novel which follows them through the different restrictions placed on slaves and women during the early 1800's.
6. ***And the Mountains Echoed*** by Khaled Hosseini
An ode to siblinghood and all the joys and heartbreaks that come with it.
7. ***Victoria: The Queen*** by Julia Baird
The extraordinary story of the world's most influential, intriguing and surprising ruler.
8. ***Price of Honor: Muslim Women Lift the Veil of Silence on the Islamic World*** by Jan Goodwin
A journey into a world where women are confined, isolated, even killed for the sake of a code of honor.
9. ***Living Islam Out Loud: American Muslim Women Speak*** by Saleemah Abdul-Ghafur
Presents the first generation of American Muslim women who have always identified as both American and Muslim. They have had to forge new identities for themselves and future generations.
10. ***Late Nights on Air*** by Elizabeth Hay
Hay chronicles her experiences as a CBC Radio journalist in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories.
11. ***The Thursday Murder Club*** by Richard Osman
A mystery about a group of senior citizens who find themselves in the center of a murder investigation.
