

1. ***One Yarmouth Summer*** (Cora Doucette, 1989)
Cora describes the summer of 1969 with Neil Robitaille, the only crew member of the schooner Bluenose to be lost at sea.
2. ***H is for Hawk*** (Helen Macdonald, 2014)
Helen MacDonald's memoir of her time training a goshawk, one of the most notoriously difficult birds to train.
3. ***Untamed*** (Glennon Doyle, 2020)
It is the story of navigating divorce, forming a new blended family, and discovering that the brokenness or wholeness of a family depends not on its structure but on each member's ability to bring her full self to the table.
4. ***Mrs. Polifax Mystery Series*** (Dorothy Gilman)
Mrs Emily Pollifax is a practical yet imaginative white-haired NJ widow with unusual hats and a brown belt in karate who volunteers for the CIA, answering to agents Carstairs and Bishop, around the world.
5. ***The Midnight Library*** (Matt Haig, 2020)
