Council Events in March

- The St. Charles KC Council hosted the Stations of the Cross event on Friday March 3 at St. Charles Church. Keith St. Louis coordinated the readers, cross bearer and candle bearers for the successful event attended by over 50 parishioners.
- The KC Men's Choir sang at the 9:00 Mass on Sunday March 5 2nd Sunday of Lent. Brother Gerald Murnane led the choir and was joined by ten members of St. Charles KC Council. The KC Men's Choir is scheduled to sing at the 9:00 Mass on the first Sunday of each month. The Men's Choir sing again on Sunday April 2 – Palm Sunday.






Free Throw Championship

After a three-year hiatus due to COVID, St. Charles Council completed the KC Free Throw Championship program this year. The Council 8325 and District 12 competitions were held on Sunday March 5 at St. Cecilia Junior High School. There were thirty-seven youth from eight different schools participating including Bishop Savaryn, Katherine Therrien, St. Charles, St. Lucy, St. Timothy, Bishop Greschuk, St. John Bosco and Father Leo Green.

The Edmonton Regional Free Throw competition and Alberta Provincial qualifying free throw event was completed on Sunday March 19 at St. Joseph Catholic High School.



















Since 1972, councils have sponsored the Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship for boys and girls from the ages of 9 to 14 to provide an athletic outlet and encourage the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Kids compete within their own gender and age and progress from council to district, regional and provincial competitions.

The Knights of Columbus Regional/Provincial #2 Free Throw Championship was held at St. Joseph Catholic High School in Edmonton on Sunday March 19, 2023. A big thank-you goes to the Knights from the various councils in Edmonton and surrounding area for making the event a success.

The event attracted seventy-three boys and girls, 9 to 14 years old from the Edmonton and surrounding area. The results of the Region #2 Free Throw Championship was sent to the Alberta Free Throw Championship chairman. The first, second and third place finishers in each category competed after the Regional event as part of the Provincial Free Throw event. Once all of the results of the Alberta Regional Free Throw competitions are in and the Provincial results are established, the Provincial champions will be notified.



Church and Rectory Maintenance
