Blessings, Rita Pfefferle, President During these last weeks of the Easter season our Sunday Gospel passages have brought us to the Upper Room on the night of the Last Supper. During his long farewell discourse, Jesus leaves us with the essence of his teachings. One of his repeated themes is the importance of unity among his disciples. Praying over his disciples, he says,

I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. Jn 17.20-21

Also during Easter we hear passages from the Acts of the Apostles, and here we come to know some of the disciples a little better. This past Sunday we saw the boldness of Philip as he went to the people of Samaria. We see that Peter and John have become leaders in the community as they too go to Samaria and invoke the Holy Spirit upon the newly baptised. Each disciple has unique talents that they contribute to the mission of spreading the Good News.

Together the Apostles and the growing community of believers have become the body of Christ. Within the Catholic Women's League, we see the body of Christ as a loving and active force dedicated to the achievement of good works through the cooperation of its members. Each woman has a variety of talents to offer, and which together with those of others accomplish so much more than any individual can on their own.

St. Paul describes beautifully the additional qualities that are found in the hearts of the faithful that make these efforts so fruitful and also make it possible to overcome the difficulties and differences that sometimes arise along the way.

I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. Eph 41-6

Together we are the body of Christ, but for each of us the contribution we make begins in our hearts. There we cultivate the foundation of our faith life through our unity with Christ. Through prayer and contemplation we continue on the journey toward imitating him more fully in our lives. We nurture our readiness to be moved with compassion, to forgive and be forgiven, to be open to perspectives and experiences that at first we find difficult to appreciate. It is here that our talents fully come to life.

Within our spiritual home of St. Charles, the CWL has an Upper Room of its own. Without exaggeration, the disciples gathered here have something in common with those gathered on the eve of our Lord's Passion. You are united as faithful followers of Christ.
