2. Kate Atkinson – *A God in Ruins*

The life of Teddy Todd, a WWII Royal Air Force bomber.

3. Jan Karon – *At Home in Mitford (Book One)*

The Mitford Series by Jan Karon features Father Timothy Kavanagh and the trials and tribulations as a priest in a small town such as Mitford.

- 5. Jan Karon These High, Green Hills (Book Three)
- 6. Sarah Ackerman *Radar Girls*

A story inspired by the real Women's Air Raid Defense, where an unlikely recruit and her sisters-in-arms forge their place in WWII history.

7. Pam Jenoff – Woman with the Blue Star

The story of Sadie, a Jewish girl hiding in the sewers with her family as German soldiers take away all the Jews. Ella, a Polish girl, who has some clearance to wander the city soon finds herself helping Sadie.

8. Joanna Goodman – *The Forgotten Daughter*

Véronique is the daughter of a separatist convicted of murdering a prominent politician in the 1970. Elodie, one of the Duplessis Orphans becomes involved with a coalition demanding justice and reparations for their suffering in the 1950s when Quebec's orphanages were converted to mental hospitals.

9. Michelle Good – *Five Little Indians*

The story of 5 Indian children taken from their homes at an early age.

10. Paula Hawkins - *The Girl on the Train*

En route to London, Rachel sees a happy couple in their home by the tracks. When papers say the wife is missing, Rachel decides to investigate.

11. Lisa Jewell - *None of This is True*

A woman finds herself the subject of her own popular true crime podcast.

12. Lawrence Hill – *The Illegal*

Examines the plight of refugees who risk everything to start over in a new country.

13. Eric Brown – *Ginny*

The story of love, hardship, and strength of the early pioneers in western Canada.
