
Council Events in December

- The KC Men's Choir sang at the 9:00 Mass on December 3 1st Sunday of Advent. Brother Gerald Murnane led the choir and was joined by members of St. Charles KC Council. The KC Men's Choir is scheduled to sing at the 9:00 Mass on the first Sunday of each month. The Men's Choir sing again on Sunday January 7 – Epiphany of the Lord.
- On Monday December 4, George Pouliot and John Mommersteeg put up two Keep Christ In Christmas banners on the fence around the Church. The KCIC Faith in Action program promotes the true spirit of Christmas in homes, schools, parishes, and communities. Councils evangelize society through their faithful acts, celebrations and a variety of activities. The Knights of Columbus offers multiple activities that promote Christmas and the season of Advent in their proper context: Journey to the Inn, Spread the Light of Christ, Crèche or Advent Wreath Blessing, and the Christmas Poster Contest. These programs are centered on the example of the Holy Family and the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.






- The KC also conducted the KC Keep Christ In Christmas poster contest and invited parish families to take part. The contest is open to all children from ages 5 to 14. The children were invited to create a poster to reflect the true meaning of Christmas and that their artwork will bring others to remember Christ in Christmas. There are three categories for the competition with winners in each category: 5-7, 8-10 and 11-14 years old. Winners for each category will receive a monetary prize from the KC and their artwork will be submitted to the next level of judging for further awards and recognition. Last year, KC Supreme Council awarded 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the three categories <u>2022-2023 Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest International Champions (kofc.org)</u>.
- The Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, December 10, was very successful. There was a lot of help from the twenty-six volunteers working both shifts. We hosted approximately 80 people after the 9:00 AM Mass and 120 people after the 11:00 AM Mass. The next Pancake Breakfast is on Sunday January 14.
- Several KC members helped the St. Charles CWL with the funeral lunch for 100 people on Friday December 15 at St. Charles Church. The KC members completed the cleanup after the lunch was prepared and served by the CWL.
- On Saturday December 9, sixteen beer booth volunteers worked in beer booth 6 at Commonwealth Stadium for the FIS World Snowboard Jump competition. In 2023, St. Charles Council members, spouses and friends worked at stadium for thirteen different events. St. Charles KC Council has worked a beer booth at Commonwealth Stadium since 1990. Funds from the beer booth are used to fulfill charitable donations and services for St. Charles Parish and other charitable groups in Edmonton. The main initiative this year is use beer booth funds to help complete maintenance work for the St. Charles Church and Rectory.

- On Saturday December 16, St. Charles KC Council members helped sponsor the second Christmas Novena Mass (Simbang Gabi) at St. Charles Church by providing ushers, lectors, offerors, music ministry and refreshments after Mass in the Activity Centre.
- The St. Charles KC Council held its KC Christmas Party on Monday December 16 in the St. Charles Activity Centre. KC member Mack Luke led the team (John Mommersteeg, George Pouliot, Dan McDonough, Cole Jensen, John Grabow, Blair McCormac, Richard Cochrane, Pat Roth, Stephen Bourque) to cook and prepare the turkey dinner including the spring mix salad appetizer, entre items (roast turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, peas and carrots with turkey gravy and cranberry sauce), dessert (assorted cheesecakes) and the bar offerings as well as decorate the activity centre for the KC Christmas Party. There were over one hundred

knights, spouses and friends who attended the Christmas Party. The attendees also brought several pieces of winter clothing including gloves, toques, scarves and coats which Ken Dufresne delivered to the St. Vincent de Paul society.

- Founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney at Saint Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut.
- The Knights of Columbus is the largest Catholic fraternal organization in the world.

- The KC is chartered to serve and provide financial aid and assistance to members and their families.
- The Order has grown to more than 16,242 councils.
- KC total membership exceeds 2 million Catholic families.
- Last year, KC members contributed over \$187 million to countless charitable efforts.
- Last year, KC members devoted over 77 million volunteer hours to their communities.
- The St. Charles Council is now 40 years old as it was chartered on March 24, 1983.
- The St. Charles Council has 187 members currently.
