




KC January 2024 Newsletter

Council Events in January

- The KC Men's Choir sang at the 9:00 Mass on January 7 Epiphany of the Lord. Brother Gerald Murnane led the choir and was joined by several members of St. Charles KC Council. The KC Men's Choir is scheduled to sing at the 9:00 Mass on the first Sunday of each month. The Men's Choir sing again on Sunday February 4 – 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time.
- The Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, January 14 was cancelled due to the extreme cold and dangerous weather in Edmonton. The next Pancake Breakfast is on Sunday February 11.
- Several KC members helped the St. Charles CWL with the funeral lunch for 100 people on Friday January 5 and the funeral lunch on Thursday January 11 for William Carroll's funeral service at St. Charles Church. The KC members completed the cleanup after the lunch was prepared and served by the CWL.
- St. Charles KC Council donated \$250 to support the 40th Annual Father Troy Basketball Tournament to be held at St. Joseph Catholic High School on February 8, 9 and 10, 2024. Opening ceremonies are on Thursday Feb 8 at noon, a dance for players on Friday night and a divine liturgy and breakfast on Saturday morning. Sixteen teams are attending the tournament including a team from Marburg, Germany.
- Financial Secretary John Grabow completed and submitted the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for 2023. The report provides statistics for the four Faith in Action activities as well as meetings, visits to the sick, bereaved, blood donations and Masses held for members. In 2023, the KC spent \$39,420 on various Faith, Family, Community and Life activities as well as provided 4,524 hours of service.
- The KC conducted the KC Keep Christ In Christmas poster contest and invited parish families to take part. The contest is open to all children from ages 5 to 14. The children were invited to create a poster to reflect the true meaning of Christmas and that their artwork will bring others to remember Christ in Christmas. There are three categories for the competition with winners in each category: 5-7, 8-10 and 11-14 years old. Winners for each category received a monetary prize from the KC and their artwork will be submitted to the next level of judging for further awards and recognition. The winners were selected by the attendees at the KC Christmas Party on December 18. 

- Founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney at Saint Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut.
- The Knights of Columbus is the largest Catholic fraternal organization in the world.
- The four principles of the Order are: Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.
- The KC is chartered to serve and provide financial aid and assistance to members and their families.
- The Order has grown to more than 16,242 councils.
- KC total membership exceeds 2 million Catholic families.
- Last year, KC members contributed over \$187 million to countless charitable efforts.
- Last year, KC members devoted over 77 million volunteer hours to their communities.
- The St. Charles Council is now 40 years old as it was chartered on March 24, 1983.
- The St. Charles Council has 187 members currently.
