


KC May 2024 Newsletter














• On Thursday May 7, ten brother knights worked over five hours at St. Charles Church to realign the pews in the church to allow increased and improved seating in the church to accommodate increased attendance at Sunday Masses, especially at the 11:00 Mass. The

As noted in the recent newsletter from the Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton, over 1000 people gathered in front of the Alberta Legislature for the annual Alberta March For Life on Thursday May 9, for the purpose of defending and celebrating the sanctity of human life. Archbishop Smith was one of the featured speakers and Fr. Dean Dowle from St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church was the MC for the event. More than ever before, the event brought together not just Catholics and Protestant Christians, but also members of many other religions, all bound together by a passion for defending life and love for both mothers and the unborn. Amongst the religious speakers at the March for Life were leaders from the Lutheran church, the Calgary Muslim Community, the Edmonton Sikh Community, the New Life Living Hope First Baptist Church of Calgary and most notably Christian Evangelist and Pro-Life advocate, Dr. Alveda King, niece to Martin Luther King Jr. John Onyskiw, State Deputy for the Knights of Columbus and Mary Hunt, Provincial President of the Catholic Women's League, were also featured speakers, along with Honorable Dan Williams MLA for Peace River and Minister for Mental Health and Addictions and Maria Jordan MacKeigan - Down Syndrome Advocate. Please pray for Canada, that we would become a nation that defends the sanctity of life and is filled with people who live their lives with self-sacrificial love!





• The KC Tree of Life continues to shine over the memorial monument in front of St, Charles Church. The Japanese Lilac tree should show its flowers soon this spring and summer. The memorial rock is a dedication to God's gift of life from conception to death. The monument includes text from Psalm 139.15.16 "... when I was growing there in secret, you know that I was there, you saw me before I was born".



 Another KC Family Movie Night was held on Saturday May 11 featuring the movie, Storks. There were over thirty people in attendance including about twenty children. Popcorn, chip snacks and drinks were provided free to all. The next movie night is in the fall of 2024.



• The Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, May 12 – Mother's Day was very successful. Just over 330 parishioners attended breakfast – about 180 after the 9:00 Mass and about 150 after the 11:00 Mass on Sunday. Over twenty-five volunteers over the two shifts cooked and served pancakes, ham and eggs. Strawberries and whipped cream were also provided for this special day honoring mothers. The next Pancake Breakfast is on Sunday June 9.

















- The KC council also conducted the Mother's Day Rose Sale on May 11 and 12. The KC sold 625 roses after the 4:30 Mass on Saturday and the two Masses on Sunday morning. We collected \$1,050 from the rose sale and provided the profit funds to the Gianna Centre, a pregnancy support centre in Edmonton.
