From The President's Desk





CWL Virtual BYOB Book Club May Reads



- 1. *A Deadly Little List*, Kay Stewart & Chris Bullock. The body of a security guard for a controversial land developer is found in a deserted cabin on Salt Spring Island. Evidence found at the crime scene suggest suicide but to RCMP Constable Dranchuk things just don t add up.
- 2. *HOPE.* The Autobiography. Pope Francis. Hope is the first autobiography in history ever to be published by a Pope. This complete

autobiography starts in the early years of the twentieth century, with Pope Francis's Italian roots continuing through his childhood, his youth, his vocation, adult life, and the whole of his papacy up to the present day.

- 3. *The Berry Pickers*, Amanda Peters. A four-year-old Mi'kmaq girl goes missing from the blueberry fields of Maine, sparking a tragic mystery that haunts the survivors, unravels a community, and remains unsolved for nearly fifty years.
- 4. **The Gun Seller**, Hugh Laurie. A comedic spy thriller about a former Scots Guardsman who gets caught up in a dangerous plot after trying to warn an assassination target.
- 5. **Bitter Chocolate**. Investigating the Dark of the World's Most Seductive Sweet, Carol Off. Bitter Chocolate is a social history, an investigative account and an eye-opening exposé of the workings of a multi-billion-dollar industry.
- 6. *Crying in H Mart*, Michelle Zauner. A moving memoir about growing up mixed-race, Korean food, losing her Korean mother, and forging her own identity in the wake of her loss.
- 7. *More or Less Maddy*, Lisa Genova. A novel about a young woman diagnosed with bipolar disorder who rejects the stability and approval found in a traditionally "normal" life for a career in stand-up comedy.
- 8. **The German Girl**, Armando Lucas Correa. A young girl flees Nazi-occupied Germany with her family and best friend, only to discover that the overseas refuge they had been promised is an illusion
- 9. **The Invention of Wings**, Sue Monk Kidd. Inspired by real events, and set in the American Deep South in the nineteenth century, it evokes a world of shocking contrasts, of beauty and ugliness, of righteous people living daily with cruelty they fail to recognize; and celebrates the power of friendship and sisterhood against all the odds.
- 10. **The Keeper of Stars**, Buck Turner. Twelve years removed from the summer when she first gave her heart away, Dr. Elizabeth (Ellie) Spencer, Professor of Astronomy at Indiana University, receives a mysterious package that has her asking that very question.
- 11. *Mistakes to Run With*, Yasuko Thank. A memoir that tears open the past to examine how circumstances, and the choices we make, dictate the people we become.
- 12. *On Isabella Street*, Genevieve Graham. Two young women with different backgrounds, attitudes, and aptitudes are living in an exciting but confusing time, the most extreme counter-culture movement the modern world has ever seen. They have little in common except for the place they both call an apartment building on Isabella Street.


